

It is presented to a graduating senior of Bethlehem Central High School in recognition of that student's contributions to their community and their excellence in scholastics and athletics. The award is presented to the recipient at the annual Memorial Day ceremonies of the Elsmere Fire Company

- Bethlehem Central student.
- Positive community contributions.
- Notable academic and athletic achievements

What students should know when applying:

- Applications become available beginning of January.

- * All applications are online. Be prepared with:
 - Unofficial transcript.
 - Email addresses of two individuals that have agreed to write a recommendation letter for you.
 - Use personal email address, not your school address.

Kevin M. Shea:

Chief Shea was a devoted member of the fire company whose death in the Line of Duty, serving the residents of the town of Bethlehem was an immense loss to the Fire Company, friends and residents of Bethlehem. Kevin Shea was a lifelong resident of Bethlehem, attending St. Thomas School, a student/athlete and graduate of BCHS, Class of 1968.

He was heavily involved in his community and was involved in many groups and civic organizations, including the N.A. Blanchard, American Legion Post #1040 and was an avid sports fan. He was employed by the Town of Bethlehem, as Chief Building Inspector, Director of Code Enforcement and Fire Marshall. In that capacity he was a very active member of the NYS Building Officials Conference.


The Shea Scholarship, while managed by CFGCR, is funded by the Elsmere Fire Company and by donations from the friends of Chief Shea and the residents of our Community.
